of Australians support the right of a religious school to **employ teachers and other staff who support the clearly stated values and beliefs of the school**



Nearly **90%** of parents with children in a faith-based school support this right



More than **60%** of Christian school parents support terminating the employment of staff if they no longer share these beliefs

of Australians consistently believe that Australian laws should **protect the right to hold and practice religious beliefs.**



The support from those actively practicing a faith has grown since 2019 to now stand at **more than 91%**

70% Support for these laws, amongst younger voters (18-24), has increased to 70%, with the support highest amongst those with university qualifications



91% Not only do over 91% of those actively practicing a religious faith supported these protections, but they were also **supported by a majority of voters without any religious faith**
